Good afternoon parents and carers,

This week we have welcomed back all our students for the first time since December, and we cannot fully express how good it is to see them all in our classrooms once again.

Monday was our final testing day and thanks to the logistical skills of Mr Newman & Mr Pyatt, we were able to get the entire school through our doors to allow us to make a start on Tuesday, and what a great restart to the school year we have had!

Our attendance figure on Tuesday was 97.3% which is a testament not only to the students but also to you as parents and carers in keeping your children safe and ready for their return.

Our focus for the remainder of this term is on the well-being of students and getting them back in to the routines of school life, and then from Easter we will be focussing on making up for the lost time, and addressing the knowledge gaps.

We would like to take this opportunity to once more pay tribute to all the parents and carers who were involved in any way, however large or small, in the home education of their children during this lockdown. Many of us here are parents as well as teachers, and we know how challenging that can be, especially if you have more than one young person at home, but it is a testament to you that so many of our students have returned to school talking about their online learning experiences and demonstrating what they have learned during that period.

Another aspect of school life we are focussing on this term is standards in and around the building and classrooms. We would be grateful if you could remind your children that coats must not be worn in the building at all. Students must carry them when moving from classroom to classroom and may only put them on once they are outside.

Mobile phones must be switched off and placed in coats or bags at all times, except for break and lunch.

Students must arrive to school ready to learn with all the equipment they need such as pens, pencils, rulers, and any books necessary for each lesson. Timetables were given out to all students on Tuesday morning to remind them of their lessons.

Students with PE on a particular day are to arrive to school wearing their PE kit. This is a safety issue during these times due to the close confines of the changing rooms.

Students have been reminded about all these expectations but we would be grateful if you could reinforce them at home for us.

As we have now returned to school, our newsletters will revert to a fortnightly basis. We hope you have found them useful during the lockdown.



#### This Weeks Numeracy Tips:

- Cooking with Maths! This is a fun way to practice numeracy skills with ratio and proportion. Think about how you can half or double the quantity
- 2. Everyday mental maths. When you go out the shops calculate mentally how much change you get from buying items.

#### DISCOVERING THE BEAUTY OF SHAPE

The previous numeracy tip we gave as a challenge to our students was to discover the beauty of shape. Many of our students at Arena found loads of 3D object in their homes and shared them with us. Some students took this further by exploring the nets of the shapes getting a feel about how to find the surface area. Great Job!


