Good afternoon parents and carers,

Year 11 Parents Evening - Schoolcloud

On Thursday of this week we held our first parents evening using our new software programme called Schoolcloud.

This is a system that allows parents to book appointments with teachers as you would normally during an in-person parents evening, and then hold that meeting virtually.

It was fantastic to see so many parents embrace this new technology and book their appointments, and thank you to those who contacted us afterwards with their positive feedback.



Nothing will ever replace the face-to-face nature of a 'normal' parents evening but those teachers who took part - and many of the parents who contacted us afterwards - said that this was an extremely effective alternative during these uncertain times.

Our other year groups will also have the opportunity for a Schoolcloud parents evening as we progress through the school year and more details will be coming out to you as that time nears.



Changes to the Test and Trace support payment for parents



Parents and carers of children who have been advised to self-isolate by their education setting or by NHS Test and Trace are now able to apply for a <u>Test and Trace Support Payment</u> or discretionary payment of £500, if they meet the eligibility criteria.

The extension of the Test and Trace Support Payment scheme, which is administered by district and unitary local authorities in England, ensures that parents receive the financial support they need if they are unable to attend work due to childcare responsibilities.

Parents and carers should apply to their local authority to receive a payment. Applications for the Test and Trace Support Payment scheme are made via the local authority in which the parent or carer resides, not the local authority where the setting is situated, if these are different.

To be eligible applicants must meet all of the criteria that:

- they are the parent or guardian of a child or young person in the same household and need to take time off work to care for them while they self-isolate. This is limited to one parent or guardian per household for the child or young person's self-isolation period
- they are employed or self-employed
- they cannot work from home while undertaking caring responsibilities and will lose income as a result
- they meet all the other means-tested eligibility criteria for a Test and Trace Support Payment or locally determined criteria for a discretionary payment That their child or young person:
- is aged 15 or under (or 25 or under with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHC)) and normally attends an education or childcare setting
- has been told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace or by their education or childcare setting because they have been identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19)

Nurseries, schools, colleges and further education providers are required to provide a letter to all parents or carers of the children advised to self-isolate, to support their application to the Test and Trace Support Payment scheme. Parents or carers will then be able to provide this letter to their local authority as evidence that their child is required to self-isolate.

Once an application for a payment has been received, the local authority will be in touch with your setting to verify the details of the child provided on the application. This will include a check of the child's name, age, address and days of self-isolation. This check is to minimise the event of fraudulent claims. It may be conducted before or after a payment is made, depending on the arrangements the individual local authority has chosen to put in place.

<u>Lateral Flow Testing at home – Easter 2021</u>

Please continue to test regularly every 3 to 5 days over the Easter break, it is recommended that you test on the same day in order to form a routine i.e. complete tests every Sunday and Tuesday evening.

A test on Sunday will ensure your child is tested prior to returning to school, giving you confidence that they are ok to return

- •My parents or carers did not go to university
- I receive Free School Meals
- ·I have a disability or learning difficulty
- I am in the care of my local authority
- ·l am a young carer
- ·I live in an area where not many young people go to university

Our young people have gone through some very trying times due to the pandemic and like most of us need a way to sometimes escape reality!




Tips on Escapism during the pandemic:

Read Fiction: Generally, the best books to read for this are fantasy books as they allow the reader to




