Good afternoon parents and carers,

This week we have been extremely busy in ensuring that our students are able to return to us safely next Tuesday.

On Monday we began our testing programme with years 7 and 8, followed by years 9, 10 & 11 on Tuesday. In all over 830 students were tested on those two days. Then on Thursday and Friday they all returned for their second tests.

Can we take this opportunity to thank all those students who came in to the building and took their tests in an impeccable manner. It was wonderful to see so many of you.

The third and final test in school takes place on Monday 8th. We are going to test the entire school in one day and this is an organisational task of mammoth proportions, so please make a note on the timetable on the following page to ensure that your child arrives at school on time.

As always, masks must be worn a social distancing must be adhered to.

In readiness for next Tuesday's full return to school, Zoom meetings have been held this week to go through all that we know with parents, to set their minds at ease. We were bowled over by the response to these meetings and cannot thank everyone enough for their overwhelming support.

On Wednesday our minibus was on another mini-tour of our community delivering food and masks, and talking to parents and students about the return to school, and once again it

was fantastic to see so many people. We must give a special thanks to the Midland Langar Seva Society for their generosity in preparing an amazing chickpea curry and samosas for our families.

Can we please remind our families that even as we return to school and restrictions slowly start to ease a little, if you have any difficulties at all, we can help. Please don't hesitate to get in touch with us.

Once we return to school we have much to do, and priority is being given to helping our students adjust to life back in school, and we will be focussing on mental health and wellbeing issues.

Another priority area is that of catch-up learning. We are committed to filling those gaps in knowledge and learning that inevitably appear following a sustained period of time out of school. We will be using the National Tutoring Programme, a national scheme partly funded by the government, alongside our own highly skilled and professional staff to try ensure that there is no lasting negative impact on our students' as a result of these two lockdowns.

Once again, everyone at Arena wishes to pass on their thanks for all the support every parent, carer and member of the Arena Community has shown to the school - and to each other - during this uncertain period, and we cannot wait until your children are back in our classrooms where they belong.

Safety Measures

To help ensure as safe a learning environment as possible, we will continue to follow the same, stringent measures as last term: year and class bubbles and zones; staggered start, finish, lunch and break times; extra hygiene practices; and additional cleaning. In line with latest advice, students will now be asked/required to wear a face covering in the classroom, as well as when moving around the school site. Please ensure your child has a face covering with them at all times — while we have a small number available in school, these are of limited supply. Pupils should attend in full school uniform, with all the correct equipment for learning. On the days that your child has PE they should attend in PE kit.


Booker Squad














Well done everyone!
