Congratulations to our first Science Ambassador. Megan has received our first enamel Science Ambassador badge.



Year 10 NHS Community Research Project

A number of our year 10 students have been selected to become NHS research ambassadors.

The project focuses on our students discovering their own personal development, career choices, in-depth knowledge, creative thinking and community outreach.

This is a new approach the NHS have put together regarding Work Experience where the students will become Health Ambassadors for the community, looking great on their CV and Personal Statements.

The idea is that the students interview and research people in the community regarding their experiences within the NHS. This particular project is Maternity Care/early childhood care.

Each student has to complete 5 interviews and then report back to an NHS panel with their findings by producing a presentation. The main aim is to help improve future treatment and resources given to expectant mothers.

Students will also have the opportunity to visit the Birmingham Women's Hospital to have hands on experience of being on the labour wards.


