When should my	×	<ul> <li>All Students MUST attend school unless they are ill.</li> <li>Students do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household has Covid.</li> </ul>
child miss school due	Carry on attending school	
to Covid-19?	Stay at home	<ul> <li>If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should stay at home and book a PCR test, NOT a Lateral Flow test.</li> <li>If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PCR test.</li> <li>If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to self-isolate. They can return on day 6 of their isolation if they have had negative lateral flow tests on Day 5 and in the morning of Day 6.</li> </ul>

COVID Risk level	Description	Actions
Level 1 - Low No school positive Covid cases	<ul> <li>No Covid cases within school for 10 school days.</li> <li>Cases of Covid are low and/or stable.</li> <li>Hospitalisation / deaths due to Covid nationally are low.</li> </ul>	No Covid measures are necessary beyond: - Reminding children of good hand-hygiene. - ensuring good ventilation in rooms with opening windows and doors. - ensuring students/staff stay at home if they have Covid symptoms and to book a PCR test.
Level 2 – Moderate Rising community transmission or emerging national situation	<ul> <li>Covid cases are recorded in the Academy within the last 10 days</li> <li>Cases of Covid are rising in the community according to local data</li> <li>Gov / Public Health England issue warnings of expected local/ national infection wave</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>As well as the above, additional measures might include:</li> <li>Ventilation of classrooms with windows opened each morning by staff.</li> <li>Staff and students will continue to test themselves using lateral flow tests twice a week.</li> <li>On-site testing after a school holiday before returning to classrooms.</li> <li>Clinically Vulnerable staff meet with Line-Managers to review their individual risk assessment &amp; discuss additional protection, working with Operations Manager (e.g. use of face coverings, reduction in movement between classes/ groups).</li> </ul>
Level 3 – Substantial	Substantial increase in covid- 19 cases reported in the Academy or across a single year group across 7 day period • Cases of Covid are rising in	As well as the above, additional measures might include: - Large indoor public events cancelled/virtual and visitors to the Academy reduced.

Covid-19 is posing a substantial threat locally/nationally.	the community according to local data • Gov / Public Health England issue new restrictions due to increased pressure on NHS	<ul> <li>Face-masks re-introduced for communal spaces for students and staff.</li> <li>Staff-room capacity is reduced to encourage more distancing.</li> <li>In-person assemblies are replaced with virtual assemblies for distancing.</li> <li>Team meetings are virtual with 1 to 1 meetings taking place at clear social distance and in face coverings.</li> </ul>
Level 4 – Severe Covid-19 is a significant threat to the daily operational running of the Academy as there is clear evidence of a severe outbreak locally.	<ul> <li>No 'slowing down' of covid cases over 10 day period, affecting student and staff attendance.</li> <li>Local data reviewed has cases over 800 per 100,000 on average over 6 catchment wards and this is rising rapidly</li> <li>Gov / Public Health England issue new restrictions due to increased pressure on NHS</li> </ul>	As well as the above, additional measures might include: • Face-masks re-introduced in classrooms for students and staff. • Enhanced cleaning at the Academy.
Level 5 - Critical Covid cases continue to increase rapidly in the Academy despite additional Level 4 measures. AND/OR Significant staff shortages due to Covid limit usual operational capacity of the Academy.	<ul> <li>Despite the measures</li> <li>indicated above, Covid cases</li> <li>within the Academy continue</li> <li>to rise within a 10 day period</li> <li>with multiple classes/cohorts</li> <li>and/or staff affected,</li> <li>suggesting that Covid is</li> <li>spreading widely throughout</li> <li>the Academy and is a critical</li> <li>threat to health and to the</li> <li>operational running of the</li> <li>Academy and contingency</li> <li>measures must be considered.</li> <li>Gov / Public Health England</li> <li>issue new restrictions due to</li> <li>increased pressure on NHS</li> </ul>	As well as the above, additional contingency measures might include: • Re-introducing class bubbles. • Combining classes for teaching in the larger spaces at the Academy. • Re-introducing a 'contingency situation' of remote learning for classes/cohorts (temporarily).
