#### What does a Hairdresser or Barber do?

Hairdressers cut, style and colour clients' hair to create the look they want.

#### How do you become a Hairdresser or Barber?

You can get into this job through:

- a college course
- an apprenticeship
- working towards this role

You'll usually need for College Route:

- 2 or more GCSEs at grades 9 to 3 (A\* to D), or equivalent, for a level 2 course
- 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A\* to C), or equivalent, for a level 3 course

You'll usually need for Apprenticeship Route:

- some GCSEs, usually including English and maths, or equivalent, for an intermediate apprenticeship
- 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A\* to C), or equivalent, including English and maths, for an advanced apprenticeship

#### **Average Salary**

From £14,000 to £30,000

The UK average salary is £30, 378

**Typical Working Week** 

37 to 40 variable

You could work: evenings / weekends

There are 37.5 hours in the average working week

## **Day-to-Day Tasks**

As a junior hairdresser, you'll:

- welcome customers
- shampoo and condition hair
- cut simple styles
- make sure towels and hair products are well stocked
- keep the salon clean and tidy
- make appointments

As a more senior hairdresser, you'll:

- talk to clients and suggest style ideas
- cut and style hair
- give advice on minor hair and scalp problems
- take payments
- order stock and promote products to customers
- keep up to date with new trends, techniques and hair products

## Working environment

You could work in a salon, at a client's home, at a health spa, at a store, at an adult care home or on a cruise ship.

Your working environment may be physically demanding.


