#### What does a Musician do?

Musicians create or perform different types of music, from classical to pop and rock.

### How do you become a Musician?

You can get into this job through:


- a university course
- a college course
- applying directly
- specialist courses run by private training organisations

You'll usually need for University Route:

- 2 or 3 A levels including music, or equivalent qualifications
- grade 8 in your main instrument
- to pass an audition
- a degree in a relevant subject for postgraduate study
- •

You'll usually need for College Route:

- 2 or more GCSEs at grades 9 to 3 (A\* to D), or equivalent, for a level 2 course
- 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A\* to C), or equivalent, for a level 3 course



There are 37.5 hours in the average working week

## Day-to-Day Tasks

In your day-to-day duties you may:

- compose, learn and rehearse music pieces
- take care of and set up your instrument for performances
- prepare for and attend auditions
- perform in front of a live audience
- take part in recording sessions
- create 'demo' recordings to promote your music
- engage with your audience through social media and website content
- arrange concerts and tours or deal with a manager or agent who does this for you

#### Working environment

- You could work in a theatre, at a music venue or at a recording studio.
- Your working environment may be emotionally demanding.
