


# Career Spotlight:

# **Zoologist**



Field biologist, wildlife biologist, conservation biologist Zoologists study animals and their behaviour.

### How do you become a Zoologist?

You can get into this job through studying for a degree in a subject like:

- zoology
- animal ecology
- animal behaviour
- conservation
- marine biology
- environmental biology

You'll need a relevant postgraduate qualification like a master's degree or PhD for some jobs, particularly in research.

### You'll usually need:

- 2 or 3 A levels, or equivalent, including biology
- a degree in a relevant subject for postgraduate study

## **Average Salary**

From £18, 000 to £48, 00 (Average £39, 000)

The UK average salary is £28,758

### **Typical Working Week**

38 - 40 Hours (Variable - could be weekends and Bank Holidays)

There are 37.5 hours in the average working week

### **Day-to-Day Tasks**

You could work in sectors like agriculture, conservation, pharmaceuticals or for the Government and you'll usually specialise in an area like:

- ecology animal environments
- herpetology reptiles
- entomology insects
- ornithology birds
- parasitology parasites
- paleozoology fossil remains

Your day-to-day tasks will vary depending on your role, sector and specialism. You could:

- carry out field and laboratory research
- study animals in their natural environment or in captivity
- identify, record and monitor animal species
- gather and interpret information
- use complex procedures, like computerised molecular and cellular analysis, and in-vitro fertilisation
- produce detailed technical reports
- give presentations and publish information in journals and books
- supervise technicians





